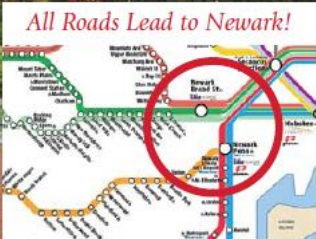

- Newark Student Undergraduate Enrollment at RU-N is now 12.7%
 - ↑ 60% since 2013-14
- 683 RU-N TOP, 70 undocumented
- 211 GSLSAMP Scholars at RU-N, 16% from Bridges to Baccalaureate Program (B2B)
 - 1,000 B2B students in 5 NJCCs that are HSIs
- 217 undocumented, 34 DREAM.US
- 163 HLLC students, 45% from Newark

Vision

By 2020, 2,020 unemployed Newark residents gain full-time employment, reducing the gap in the annual average unemployment rate between the State of New Jersey (5.0%) and Newark (7.9%), significantly reducing poverty among residents.
