Last-in, full-tuition scholarships for students with adjusted gross incomes of \$60,000 or less who are Newark residents or NJ county college transfers



Vision

By 2020, 2,020 unemployed Newark residents gain full-time employment, reducing the gap in the annual average unemployment rate between the State of New Jersey (5.0%) and Newark (7.9%), significantly reducing poverty among residents.


