Open Access Policy resolution passed by Rutgers University Senate in a near-unanimous vote October 2012



Timeline

Fall, 2011 Senate's RGPEC is charged to look into an Open Access policy) and RGPEC forms its Open Access Subcommittee

October 19, 2012 Senate passes Open Access Policy Resolution

February 19, 2013 President Barchi signs off

Oct., 2014 Rutgers Open Access Policy enters the Rutgers Policy Library

March, 2015 Letter sent to deans, announcing policy going into effect Sept. 1

Sept. 1, 2015 Policy goes into effect

What is Open Access?

"Open-access (OA) literature is digital, online, free of charge, and free of most copyright and licensing restrictions.

What makes it possible is the **internet** and the **consent of the author** or copyright-holder.

In most fields, **scholarly journals do not pay authors**, who can therefore consent to OA without losing revenue."





- Website developed to implement the Rutgers Open Access Policy
- One-stop shop about OA & policy
- SOAR is a service of the Rutgers institutional repository (RUcore)
- Gathers University scholarship in one place and makes it available on the internet
- Crawled by Google; making the research discoverable on the internet
- Primarily journal articles, conference proceedings, and similar scholarship



Useful Features

- Download statistics by country for each article (demonstrating impact)
- Bibliography link you can use (for email signature, LinkedIn, etc.)
- Supplementary data can link with the publication
- Crawled by Google



How the OA Policy Works

- Continue to publish in your journal of choice
- Deposit in SOAR at no cost to you (most publishers allow deposit of your author final version)
- Simple and easy deposit process
- SOAR staff researches publisher permissions so you don't have to
- Prospective from September 1, 2015




Five Easy Steps

- Your article is formally accepted for publication (post peer review)
- 2. Go to SOAR (soar.rutgers.edu) and click



- 3. Log in with NetID and supply basic info
- 4. Upload your Accepted Manuscript (AM)
- 5. In 1-2 days, receive your DOI to post wherever you'd like


RU Policy Innovation: Graduate Students

- Ensure access over time


